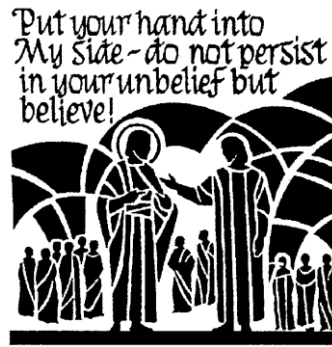

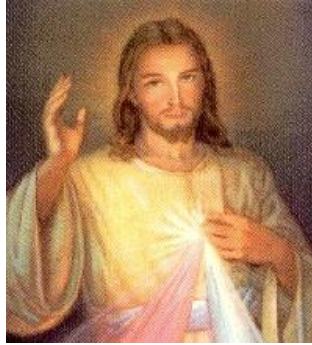

THE FIFTY DAYS OF EASTER



Today is "Divine Mercy Sunday". Jesus said to the apostles: Receive the Holy Spirit. Those whose sins you forgive they are forgiven..." The ministry of mercy and forgiveness which Jesus proclaimed, has been handed on to the Church. St. Faustina, a Polish nun, placed a great emphasis upon this aspect of God, his merciful love for all. In recognition of the devotion to the Divine Mercy, this Sunday is set aside to celebrate this gift of forgiveness and reconciliation and to call to mind the mercy and compassion of God.

The Gospel read today is echoed in every Mass at the sign of peace which begins with this prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles, 'peace, I leave with you; my own peace I give to you...' Since it is a ritual, the sign of peace can become automatic, and sometimes we do it without being aware of what it means. Try to be aware of what you are doing the next time you share the sign of peace. As you offer the greeting to those around you, look the other person in the eyes and seek to communicate by your presence, the love and peace of the risen Lord.
