OUR LADY HOME VISITATION



The family home visitation will aid families in responding to the requests made by the Blessed Mary during her various apparitions.

Her requests are threefold:

- **Return to God** (turn away from sin and obey the ten Commandments)
- **Make reparation for sins** (practice some form of penance and sacrifice in atonement for our own sins and the sins of others)
- **Pray the Rosary for Peace** (She asked us to pray the Rosary every day).

The commitment required of those families desiring to welcome Mary into their homes is:

- Make a special effort to avoid sin during her visit to your home.
- Perform some form of penance or sacrifice during the week of her visit in reparation for sin.
- Pray the Rosary as a family in the presence of her statue each day, or at least whatever part of a Rosary can be accomplished.

A family will have the Virgin Statue at their home for a week. The first week will begin on Saturday, August 31st. There will be a sign-up sheet at both parishes leading up to the date.

HOLY SPOUSES SAINTS THAT MARRIED OTHER SAINTS



Saints Louis Martin and Zelig Guerin:

Parents of St. Therese of the Lisieux and the a true testimony of Christian marriage. They had 9 children. Four died prematurely and 5 daughters who survived had a vocation to the religious life.

Saints Gregory and Nonna:

Parents of 3 Saints: St. Gorgonia, St. Caesarius and St. Gregory of Nazianzus, Doctor of the Church. Nonna convinced her husband to convert to Christianity, as he was a member of the Hysistarians, a Jewish-Pagan Sect. Such was his conversion that at the age of 60 he was elected Bishop of Nazianzus.

Saints Aquila and Priscilla:

They were a Jewish couple from Rome. They hosted St. Paul on his visit to Corinth and were probably converted by him. They joined him on his trip to Ephesus. In the era of house of churches, theirs's was an important one. According to tradition they were martyred in Rome on their return.

Saints Joachim and Anne:

They are the patron Saints of Grandparents. They both were people with a deep faith and trust in God. Joachim and Anne were in charge of educating their daughter Mary, teaching her to love God and preparing her for her Mission.

Blessed Luigi and Maria Beltrame:

When they were young, Maria had serious complication in her first pregnancy and the doctors recommended an abortion. The couple refused and Maria gave birth to a baby girl. They had 3 more children: 2 boys and 1 girl, all with vocation to the priesthood and to religious life.

Saints Vincent and Waldetrudis:

Were a catholic marriage of 7th century and parents of 4 saints: Landericus, Madalberta, Adeltrudis and Dentelin. When the children grew up, the couple separated without dissolving their marriage, to dedicated themselves to the religious life.

Saints Isidore the Farmer and Maria de la Cabeza: These patron saints of farmers performed their labors with humility and patience. They lived a simple life, marked by a deep devotion to the Virgin Mary and the charitable spirit. They miraculously saved their son, who one day fell in a well, with their prayers.

Saints Gordianus and Silvia:

Parents of Pope St. Gregory the Great. Apparently, they were both from a distinguished family. They were devout Christians and they raised their children (both St. Gregory and a second son) in the faith.
