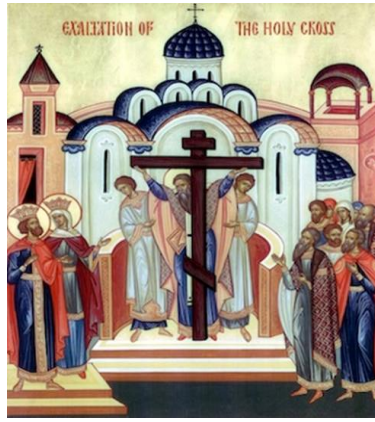

## EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS - SEPTEMBER 14TH



The Church celebrates the discovery and the recovery of the True Cross of Jesus Christ.

The Roman Emperor Constantine's mother, St. Helena, went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to locate and preserve the relics of the Christian faith. One of her goals was to find the place of Jesus' crucifixion and the very Cross on which he was hung. She discovered the spot and found the True Cross. According to the historian Rufinus, the identity of the True Cross was confirmed by a miraculous healing after St. Macarius recited a prayer. The date of this discovery and miracle, according to tradition, was May 3rd, 326 A.D.

The True Cross is a most valuable treasure of the Church. The Church has a long tradition of venerating the Cross, that's why Catholic churches always have large crucifixes in prominent places. In the Catholic Church venerating the Cross is a liturgical tradition during Holy Week. It's also why Catholic Christians keep crosses and crucifixes in their homes, usually on their wall or above their doorway.

If you don't have a cross or a crucifix in your home, consider choosing one on this special feast day, have it blessed, and place it in a prominent place in your home where it will be honored and venerated.

## FEAST OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS - SEPTEMBER 15TH

Devotion to the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady has its roots in Sacred Scripture and in Christian piety, which always associates the Blessed Mother with her suffering Son.

This feast (September 15) is dedicated to the spiritual martyrdom of Mary, Mother of God, and her compassion with the sufferings of her Divine Son, Jesus. In her suffering as co-redeemer, she reminds us of the tremendous evil of sin and shows us the way of true repentance. May the numerous tears of the Mother of God be conducive to our salvation.

As Mary stood at the foot of the Cross on which Jesus hung, the sword of sorrow Simeon had foretold pierced her soul. Below are the seven sorrows of Mary:

1. **The prophecy of Simeon** (*Luke 2:25-35*)
2. **The flight into Egypt** (*Matthew 2:13-15*)
3. **Loss of the Child Jesus for three days** (*Luke 2:41-50*)
4. **Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary** (*Luke 23:27-31; John 19:17*)
5. **Crucifixion and Death of Jesus** (*John 19:25-30*)
6. **The body of Jesus being taken from the Cross** (*Psalms 130; Luke 23:50-54; John 19:31-37*)
7. **The burial of Jesus** (*Isaiah 53:8; Luke 23:50-56; John 19:38-42; Mark 15:40-47*)
