THE CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD-website: <http://www.cgsac.ca/learn.html>

Is a Christian Ministry for children aged 3-12 years that is based on the Bible and liturgy of the church; it is inspired by the principles of Montessori education. This Ministry provides:

- An opportunity for children to fall in love with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, in a child-friendly space called an atrium – located in a church or school.
- Guided activity to aid meditation on Bible scripture and the mysteries of the Christian faith once a week - in small groups, facilitated by trained adults (catechists).
- That each child's unique spiritual needs and abilities are respected and nurtured.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is recognized as a ministry offering religious formation for children by several Catholic Churches. St. Michael's Parish is considering running the program beginning next year. BOOK OF THE MONTH

- **Acts of the Apostles in the Bible**

Who doesn't like sequels to their favorite books or movies? That is exactly what the **Acts of the Apostles** book is. Acts, as it is commonly called, is a second volume of the **Gospel of Luke**. Both were likely written by **Luke**, who's said to be an early Christian who traveled with the apostle Paul. The gospel functions as the first volume of the set, detailing the story of Jesus - the founder of Christianity - while Acts functions as a second volume, telling the stories of the **apostles**, or messengers, of the founding figure. Scholars believe both volumes were written at the end of the second century CE - about 50 or more years after the death and resurrection of Jesus.

- **Prayer for Beginners by Peter Kreeft**

Peter Kreeft brings his unique insights to this most important area of our spiritual lives. He claims he himself is still a beginner in prayer, and this book is for all those, like him, who feel that they are not good at praying but desire to become much better at it. Thus, Kreeft offers simple, but profound advice and practical steps for developing a prayer life based on the time-tested wisdom of the saints and great spiritual writers, especially the principles found in Brother Lawrence's classic, *The Practice of the Presence of God*. In short, straight-forward and unsentimental chapters, Kreeft covers all the key areas for understanding and developing that intimate form of communication with our Creator that we call prayer. He covers such areas as the necessity of prayer, various motives and methods, steps, patience, suffering, sin, faith, and grace.
