### 33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



St. Luke's gospel was chosen for today's Mass so we can do a bit of spiritual stock-taking. Next Sunday will be the special feast day of the Kingship of Christ and begin our new liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent. To help us to be honest with ourselves in our stock-taking we are reminded today that this world will come to an end one day. We do not know when or how, but that end will come. It will be followed immediately by the general judgment. Christ will come in power and glory to judge the whole human race. Each one will receive the sentence he merited while on earth. The just will enter with Him into eternal glory. The wicked will go to their place of suffering, sorrow and remorse.

Each one of us can put the following simple question to ourselves this very moment. How would I fare if I were called before the judgment seat of God today?

The Christian who wants to die in the state of grace, that is, in the friendship of God (and can there be any real Christian who would not want to?) has but one way of making sure of this. He is to try to live always in God's friendship. The man who does this by living his Christian life daily need not fear death. It may be a sudden death, but it will never be an unprovided-for death.

#### BOOK OF THE MONTH

##### • Acts of the Apostles in the Bible

Who doesn't like sequels to their favorite books or movies? That is exactly what the **Acts of the Apostles** book is. Acts, as it is commonly called, is a second volume of the **Gospel of Luke**. Both were likely written by **Luke**, who's said to be an early Christian who traveled with the apostle Paul. The gospel functions as the first volume of the set, detailing the story of Jesus - the founder of Christianity - while Acts functions as a second volume, telling the stories of the **apostles**, or messengers, of the founding figure. Scholars believe both volumes were written at the end of the second century CE - about 50 or more years after the death and resurrection of Jesus.

##### • Prayer for Beginners by Peter Kreeft

Peter Kreeft brings his unique insights to this most important area of our spiritual lives. He claims he himself is still a beginner in prayer, and this book is for all those, like him, who feel that they are not good at praying but desire to become much better at it. Thus, Kreeft offers simple, but profound advice and practical steps for developing a prayer life based on the time-tested wisdom of the saints and great spiritual writers, especially the principles found in Brother Lawrence's classic, *The Practice of the Presence of God*. In short, straight-forward and unsentimental chapters, Kreeft covers all the key areas for understanding and developing that intimate form of communication with our Creator that we call prayer. He covers such areas as the necessity of prayer, various motives and methods, steps, patience, suffering, sin, faith, and grace.
